#### SUNDAY SERVICES

Despite some challenges with older children attending school on Sundays, the younger children showed great enthusiasm in participating during lessons and singing. I also noticed growing interest from new children who have started joining us regularly, which is a positive sign for the ministry.

At B.H.C, the Sunday service was lively, and the teachers took time to involve the children through memory verses, prayer and small group discussions. Each group had the chance to present a summary of the lesson, and this helped reinforce the message. The children showed maturity and teamwork,

especially during the activities where they worked together in small groups to role play bible stories.
